

Guest Suite Booking Procedure

BOOKING PROCEDURES: Check availability at www.winterra.ca

Only residents can make bookings for guests by emailing the Facilities coordinator at winterra@telus.net.

Complete 'Guest Suite Reservation Information form' (found in 'Forms' drop down menu). Payment must be received by Facilities Coordinator to confirm booking.

- **If another request comes in for the same dates, the booking will go to the unit resident whose email request is received first along with payment.**

Under normal circumstances you will always receive a response in 24 hours.

Payment can be made via e-transfer to the Facilities Coordinator email, cash or cheque (payable to KAS 3521) and deposited in the Strata Council mailbox in the foyer.

Rate for the guest suite is \$35 per night plus one of \$35 cleaning fee.

Receipt for all transactions will be supplied showing door access code for Guest Suite.

Due to Covid protocols additional information regarding guest suite amenities can be found on the Guest Suite Reservation Form. Guest Suite check in is from 3pm day of booking and check out by 10am on day of departure.

Residents booking the Guest Suite or Clubhouse will be responsible for any Bylaw infringements or damage to property incurred by their guests.

HVAC MAINTENANCE

Schedule a Seasonal Tune-up

Routine maintenance is one of the best ways to protect your investment and keep your HVAC system running smoothly. During a routine tune-up, an HVAC technician inspects all the components within your unit to make sure they are all functioning correctly. This should include a changing of the air filter. Ask your technician to clean the coils.

When manufacturers estimate the lifespans of heating and cooling equipment, they assume that the owner will be keeping up with annual tune-ups. If you fail to do so, you're likely decreasing how long your system can last. Additional benefits of regular maintenance include improved efficiency and lower monthly bills.

Don't Overdo It

When it's hot and humid outside, it's tempting to drop the temperature on your thermostat drastically to enjoy a cooler indoor atmosphere. However, putting too much pressure on your system can lead to premature breakdowns that can be expensive to repair.

Instead of manually setting your thermostat to 65 degrees when the temperature spikes, set a cooling schedule that allows the system to cycle on and off more consistently and maintain a reasonable temperature. Doing so will take some pressure off your air conditioner and keep your bills under control. It's important to also note that significantly dropping the temperature on the thermostat won't cool down your house any faster.

Some manufacturers recommend that AC temperatures not be set lower than 24 degrees Celsius/74 degrees Fahrenheit.

Replace the HVAC Air Filter

The air filter in your system also impacts how efficiently it operates during the summer months. When it's clogged with dirt and debris, the air struggles to move through the system, using more energy to cool down your space. Additionally, a dirty air filter can impact your home's indoor air quality since contaminants can move into the ducts and settle there.
