

The Winterra Strata is not responsible nor is required to provide a removal service for items not permitted in recycle or wet garbage bins. Please:

1. Take them to the landfill

PLAN TO REDUCE HVAC BREAKDOWNS DURING EXTREME HEAT CONDITIONS

HVAC MAINTENANCE

Schedule a Seasonal Tune-up

Routine maintenance is one of the best ways to protect your investment and keep your HVAC system running smoothly. During a routine tune-up, an HVAC technician inspects all the components within your unit to make sure they are all functioning correctly. This should include a changing of the air filter. **Ask your technician to clean the coils.**

When manufacturers estimate the lifespans of heating and cooling equipment, they assume that the owner will be keeping up with annual tune-ups. If you fail to do so, you're likely decreasing how long your system can last. Additional benefits of regular maintenance include improved efficiency and lower monthly bills.

Don't Overdo It

When it's hot and humid outside, it's tempting to drop the temperature on your thermostat drastically to enjoy a cooler indoor atmosphere. However, putting too much pressure on your system can lead to premature breakdowns that can be expensive to repair.

Keep your thermostat at a reasonable temperature throughout the whole day to avoid the HVAC from overtaxing. Even raising your temperature a few degrees during extreme heat will take some pressure off your air conditioner and keep your bills under control. It's important to also note that significantly dropping the temperature on the thermostat won't cool down your house any faster.

Some manufacturers recommend that AC temperatures not be set lower than 24 degrees Celsius/74 degrees Fahrenheit.

Replace the HVAC Air Filter

The air filter in your system also impacts how efficiently it operates during the summer months. When it's clogged with dirt and debris, the air struggles to move through the system, using more energy to cool down your space. Additionally, a dirty air filter can impact your home's indoor air quality since contaminants can move into the ducts and settle there.

Building Security

Parkade/Building Security is Everyone's Responsibility.

PARKADE

- LOCK YOUR VEHICLE
- Do not leave valuables in plain site or in back of pickups
- do not leave building fobs or keys in console
- when entering garage/entrance doors make sure they are closed and no one follows you in

LOBBY ENTRANCE

- only those with fob entry or buzzed in should be permitted to enter the building
- check and remove all delivered parcels and mail on a daily basis
- report all suspicious behaviour to Facilities Coordinator

Winterra Fire Smart

Thank you to everyone who turned out for **FireSmart Preparedness Day** on May 14th or the evening session on May 30th! All others who received the informational handouts in their doors are encouraged to read them, with particular attention to Winterra's **Evacuation Plan** pamphlet.

We would also like to emphasize the importance of keeping balconies and patios clear of flammable items during a heatwave or evacuation alert. Embers from distant wildfires are known to travel up to two kilometers and can easily ignite combustibles on the building's exterior.

Items such as carpets, wicker or fabric-covered furniture, cushions and clothing are a wildfire hazard. They should be brought into your suite or covered with a welding blanket during times of high risk, so please take the time to look at what you have outside.

As part of our FireSmart initiatives we have a well-maintained building that passed the FireSmart Inspection in March with a good grade. Our plants and landscaping in zone one (within 3 meters of the building) were better, more fire-resistant choices, and we continue to monitor the coniferous trees in zone two (within 30 meters).

Finally, we would like to thank everyone who were vigilant in reporting unauthorized vehicles and campers trespassing on the undeveloped property to the west of our building. This was another FireSmart initiative in collaboration with the RCMP and the property owner that resulted in a lower wildfire risk, and the bonus of reduced noise.

We wish everyone a safe and enjoyable summer with continued awareness of wildfire prevention and preparedness.

Newspapers & Inserts, cardboard & paperboard (food boxes) milk, juice & soup cartons, office & school paper, junk mail & catalogues, phone books, paperback books & magazines.



PLASTIC

Plastic bottles, cups & containers, household bottles, jars & jugs, dairy containers & lids, produce, bakery and deli containers & lids.



METAL

Aluminum bottles & cans, tin cans, tin foil, empty aerosol cans.



NO THANKS

- X NO FOOD, liquids, diapers, batteries or needles
- X NO tissue paper
- X NO pet food bags
- X NO plastic bags, wrap or film
- X NO motor oil bottles
- X NO electronics, propane tanks
- X NO styrofoam or scrap metal
- X NO food or beverage glass bottles & jars
- X NO window glass, ceramic, china and drinking glasses
- X NO aluminum pans, empty paint cans
